EMS

Ron Grout reported for the month of May 13 medic and 2 fire runs. In June there were 7 medic and 3 fire runs. In July there were 8 medic and 1 fire run. During August there were 12 medic and 1 fire run. The average response time was 8.5 minutes from time of dispatch to time on scene. Injuries happening as part of household and vehicular accidents continue to dominate, with illnesses as the second cause for dispatch. Please check the batteries in your smoke detectors.

Sheriff's Beat

The Sheriff's reported that robberies are picking up, so be aware. Gary Back is in charge of abandoned vehicles. His number is 440-6085. Also it has been reported people who are turning at the intersection of State Route 41 and Children's Home Rd. are going left of center.

Township Roads

The township is responsible for the township roads. They are Adams, Benham, Cedar Cove, Dayton Brandt North of 41, Hickory Hollow, Hufford, Lehman, Marshall, McCandliss, Mill, Rudy, Sanders, Sayers North side, Shaggy Bark, Gearhart South of Tipp Elizabeth, Weddle, and Widener. The Trustees plow these roads in the winter and have the weeds cut the rest of the year. They are not responsible for the county roads.

Barn Again!

This is a national program to preserve historic farm buildings. This program helps owners rehabilitate them back to productive use. In Ohio we have a web site developed by the Ohio Historic Preservation Office and the Ohio State University Extension which describes the barn preservation program. Election Changes

For the November 7 election, there are two important changes.

1. Proof of identity will be required at the polls. This could be: current and valid photo ID, military ID, copy of utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check or government document showing name and current address. Voters cannot use notice sent by Board of Elections.
2. Absentee voting no longer requires a reason to vote early. It is "no fault early voting." Submit request for absentee ballot in writing to

Include name, signature, address at which you are registered, date of birth, election you wish to vote, address ballot mailed to, and one of the following: drivers license number, last four digits of Social Security number, or copy of current/valid ID. Absentee voting must be received by Tuesday, November 7th.

3. Walk in voting at the Election Board, 201 W. Main Street, Troy, is until Monday, November 6th.
